The P.E.T.S Act

The official name, Pets Evacuation and Transportation Standards Act of 2006 is legislation that amends the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act.

The amendment is intended to ensure that state and local emergency preparedness operational planning addresses the needs of individuals with household pets and service animals following a major disaster or emergency.

What is a disaster?

A sudden event, like an accident or a natural catastrophe, that causes great damage or loss of life. Animal Response Teams (ART) respond to disasters ONLY when requested by emergency management.

How do I prepare my pets at home?

- 1. PACK a PET Go-Bag
- 2. **EVACUATE** with your PET
- 3. TAG your PET

How do I prepare my pet care facility?


- 1. PLAN disaster operations, communications & evacuation procedures
- 2. EVACUATE safely with defined evacuation procedures
- 3. TRANSITION smoothly with defined disaster procedures

What is a local animal response team & what do animal response team volunteers do? A local team can be a small task force of ART volunteers in a county or a full regional team comprised of the ART volunteers in all the counties assigned to a region. Volunteers set up & manage temporary animal shelters where they provide care, comfort, & safety for pets displaced in a disaster. Volunteers also educate the public on pet disaster preparedness and raise awareness about the Animal Response Team Coalition of Kansas.

Preparation is key! Please take time to plan as a family or as a pet care facility.
