HOW IS THE STATE VOAD STOOD UP?

Aside from those organizations who have an MOU with the Kansas Division of Emergency Management to be first responders, the VOAD must wait until we are asked for help before we can send agencies in to a disaster situation in any county.

You as County Emergency Managers make that call to KDEM

We will only call up or send agencies who are able to supply goods and services requested by the County Emergency Manager who is responding to the disaster.

BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS

With already established relationships, the Kansas VOAD Member Agencies will be better prepared to respond and to work with County Emergency Management to meet community needs.

When you as County Emergency Managers know who to call in times of disaster it will make your job easier, knowing that areas of need are being addressed, allowing you to move on to what is most important in getting your community back to normal.
