Program Management of the Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) program. Interface with FEMA to review federal policies that impact the HMA program and complete program reporting requirements. Perform site visits and audit coordination. Seek mitigation opportunities within Kansas and inform stakeholders of HMA program opportunities. Maintain Kansas Hazard Mitigation Plan and regional mitigation plans. Provide technical assistance to stakeholders in the development of various types of emergency management plans to primarily include mitigation plans, delivery of HMA program education and project development/implementation. Allocate budgeted monies and approve expenditures. Complete HMA program grant applications. Meet with County Commissioners, County Emergency Managers, State and Federal agencies and other local officials on issues related to program mitigation. Conduct meetings with program stakeholders to develop inclusive mitigation plans. Develop and deliver training focused on awareness of program mitigation opportunities and technical project application development to program stakeholders.
